Clinical Scenario 1

1. A 12-year-old boy with history of type-I diabetes is admitted with a 6 hour history of vomiting, abdominal pain and drowsiness. On questioning he admitted missing three doses of his regular insulin. On examination he is drowsy, dehydrated and tachypnoeic. BP is 80/60 mmHg and heart rate is 120 bpm.

Random Blood Glucose – 310 mg/dl Urine – ketones +++

Discuss the immediate and long term management of this condition

Clinical Scenario 2

A 25-year-old primigravida in her 26th week of pregnancy undergoes a glucose tolerance test as screening for gestational diabetes mellitus (GDM). She has a family history of Type-2 DM. GDM is confirmed with an oral glucose tolerance test (OGTT). Discuss the pharmacological management of diabetes during pregnancy and labour.
