KEY PERFORMANCE TARGETS OF STUDY PROGRAMMES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PERADENIYA

Background

Key performance indicators (KPI) have been identified as important items that monitor, at a glance, progress on the strategic plan of the University. These indicators are all quantitative in nature and are measured annually, either at the end of each academic or financial year. Therefore, as a follow-up action of the Management Committee meeting of the CQA, the Director, Academic Affairs was given the responsibility to develop performance targets for study programmes of University of Peradeniya. The Director/AA reviewed performance targets provided by the Faculties and suggested the followings as potential performance targets of University of Peradeniya to be discussed at the CQA and ADPC. This include process-based and outcome-based targets (Table 1). The identification of the impact-based performance targets are difficult.
